GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF TASK(S) AND OBJECTIVES TO BE ACHIEVED

Under the general supervision of the Coordinator of the Abidjan Convention Secretariat, and the Regional Coordinator of the CCLME project, under the orientation and direct supervision of the Biodiversity, Habitat and Water Quality thematic component leader, and based on information tobe collected in collaboration with local representatives in the different CCLME countries, the consultant will develop a geo-referenced database on Habitats and Biodiversity that the consultant will use to produce maps. The consultant will suggest technical modalities to connect maps and databases to CCLME and the Abidjan Convention websites. The consultant's work also includes the training of representatives of countries in the use of GIS tools. To carry out the training, the consultant will choose the most suitable tool (the more used in the area and the least expensive).

The Consultant incumbent will specifically:

- Specify to the representatives of CCLME countries the data format that will be used to collect data and information
- Work with representatives in CCLME countries to collect all data and information needed to create a geo-referenced data base on habitats and biodiversities of the marine ecosystems and estuaries of the 7 countries (Morocco, Mauritania, Cape Verde, Senegal, The Gambia, Guinea, Guinea Bissau)
- Work closely with the Spanish Institute Of Oceanography and EAF Nansen, with the support of the CRU of CCLME, for obtaining complementary data and information on the CCLME region
- Creation of geo-referenced Database on Habitats and Biodiversities with a description of the data
- Produce maps of habitats and biodiversity in these ecosystems
- Connect these maps to CCLME and Abidjan Convention's websites
- Provide copies on CD
- Organize a training in the use of GIS tools choosing the more accessible software supports in CCLME countries
- Present the work to the Biodiversity, Habitat and Water Quality working group for validation
