

Draft CCLME stakeholder participation and communication strategy







Why this strategy?

- Strong stakeholder participation is important to ensure the quality and accuracy of CCLME project outputs (TDA, SAP etc.)
- During project preparatory phase a first draft stakeholder participation strategy was developed in consultation with countries
- One of the immediate activities identified in the work plan was to finalize this plan – and to add a communication component

This draft strategy is a continuation of the work done in preparatory phase

Strategy objectives

- Ensure **adequate stakeholder involvement** in CCLME project activities;
- Ensure **visibility, transparency and communication** of the CCLME project objectives, activities and results to all major stakeholders in order to increase the level of public awareness and understanding of the issues addressed by the CCLME project; and
- To enable the CCLME project to serve as a reliable source of information and advice on issues addressed by the project



How to achieve the strategy objectives?

 Identify major stakeholders in the CCLME and suitable ways to involve them in the project; and

Use suitable communication channels and key messages.

Main stakeholder participation mechanisms in the CCLME project

- Project Steering Committee, National Inter-Ministerial Committees (NICs) and National Coordinating Units (NCUs)
 - Overall and continuous guidance to the project
- Technical working groups
 - For information and guidance on specific technical issues to guide TDA and SAP processes



Main stakeholder participation mechanisms in the CCLME project (cont)

Stakeholder fora to guide TDA/SAP processes:

- National
 - List of stakeholders identified by countries during project preparatory phase to be verified and updated
- Regional
 - West African Marine and Coastal Forum (Forum Marin et Côtier de l'Afrique de l'Ouest)
 - CCLME to discuss with PRCM how to best use the Forum for broad and large-scale regional stakeholder consultations on the CCLMETDA, SAP etc.

Important to include local stakeholders and private sector



Main stakeholder participation mechanisms in the CCLME project (cont)

- Collaboration in project implementation including in the implementation of demonstration projects
 - Direct input on project activities from project partners (development partners, fisheries organizations etc.)
 - Important involvement of local stakeholders, private sector etc.
- Communication activities
 - To share valuable information to all stakeholders including the general public

Communication activities - important considerations

- What do you want to communicate to who?
 - Determination of key messages and target audiences
- How do you best reach your target audience?
 - Determination of communication tools, activities and channels



CCLME communication tools

- Website (<u>www.canarycurrent.org</u>)
 - Should be updated regularly
 - Should be expanded to include information gathered by project
 - Could be expanded to allow interactive features such as:
 - Space for each working group to upload / discuss
 / conclude data, reports etc.
 - Possibility for National teams to upload reports, information etc.

Newsletter

 Showcase project activities as well as stakeholder contributions to the activities







CCLME communication tools (cont)

Workshops and meetings

- To get input on specific issues and move project implementation forward

• Print documents

Publications, policy papers, fact sheets, training materials etc.

• Promotion materials

- Posters, brochures etc. as required

Press releases

For especially newsworthy events — release of publications etc.

Community outreach

 In collaboration with project partners and national teams, especially relevant for some of the demonstration projects



Evaluation of strategy

Through monitoring / evaluating:

- The traffic on the CCLME website (Google Analytics)
- The understanding of CCLME goals/objectives / issues addressed among stakeholders
- The level of participation in CCLME activities

Should be considered in the mandatory mid-term and final evaluations (according to GEF requirements)
